Experience and Areas of Expertise:

- Started career as a Lecturer in Intermediate College and worked in various degree colleges in Uttar Pradesh and Uttaranchal
 - Taught students for six years and gained experience in teaching Physics at different levels.
 - Different processes of learning and evaluation techniques, both theory as well as practical aspects of Physics teaching, were internalized and used in the career at various levels of work.
- Acquired profound knowledge of question paper setting, evaluation and different related areas of learning. The experience gained was used while working as an educational administrator and as a Principal of Intermediate College in remote area of Nainital District for about three years.
 - Various aspects of school administration, teachers' competence, performance appraisal and preparation of institutional plans, their implementation were the focus areas.
- Worked as Educational Planner and Administrator at District Level in the capacity of Basic Shiksha Adhikari as well as District Inspector of Schools.
- Supervised Primary and Secondary Education Programme for about six years in different
 Districts of Uttar Pradesh and acquired sound knowledge of preparation and

Financial Management:

Acquired deep knowledge of financial rules and regulation while working with the Finance department in Government of Uttar Pradesh. Responsibilities included:

- Preparing budget estimates for the State
- Implementation of store purchase rules
- Supervision of the audit and accounting process and presentation of the financial reports to competent bodies, namely the Accountant General, Uttar Pradesh and the Public Account Committee through the Government.

Significant Academic Ventures:

As the Chairman of the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS), took significant steps to put the open schooling system in India on a sound pedestal. These inter alia included:

- -Strengthening of process of planning.
- Implementation and monitoring of open schooling programmes.
- Expansion of Open Vocational Education Programme, the On Demand Examination System and e-governance.
- Realizing that the open schooling programme with inherent flexibilities has potential to meet substantially the challenge of universalisation of school education, a comprehensive re-engineering of the process as an integral part of the strategic approach for promotion of open schooling was initiated.
- Steps taken in collaboration with international organizations like Commonwealth of Learning(COL), UNESCO, and UNFPA for promotion of Open Schooling in developing countries, particularly in Asia and Africa, through advocacy, consultancy and capacity building programmes under the Open Schooling Association of Commonwealth (OSAC) and the International Centre for Training in Open Schooling (ICTOS) located in NIOS.
- Through consultation with experts, developed the Vision 2020 document for NIOS. NIOS has been marching ahead steadily making strides in open schooling programmes and activities at national and international level.
